Project Ready

Project Ready is a hands-on work readiness and personal development program that incorporates a Certificate II in Active Volunteering. It's aimed at supporting a wide range of students to assist with career pathway exploration and develop work readiness skills, in order to successfully transition into further training or the workforce. 13 Project Ready students graduated from the program in November 2021, taking away valuable skills that will help them in their chosen career pathway.

How work works

We ran a youth-led research project designed to explore local employer needs, their expectations of work readiness, what young people receive in preparation for the world of work while they are at school and what they wish they learnt. 4 interns were trained in research and interview skills, resume writing and taught the importance of networking. The intern interviewed 16 employers and took part in 4 media engagements promoting their findings.

In partnership with the DET, we coordinated and delivered SIRs in Moira Shire and Shepparton. The aim of each SIR was to bring schools and industry together to provide more successful pathways and transitions into employment for young people.

SWL Portal

The Structured Workplace Learning (SWL) Portal has been designed to increase opportunities for young people to learn more about the world of work, improve their skills and workplace knowledge through 'on the job' experience. Students can search online for work placements and school-based apprenticeship/traineeship opportunities with employers. Within our region we have created more than 339 opportunities with more than 160 local employers across 10 key industry areas.
